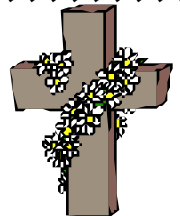
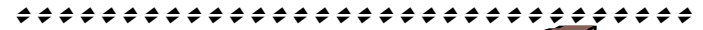


**St. Patrick's Day Celebration**

**There will be NO potluck in March due to other dinner activities.**

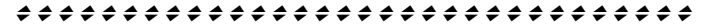
...to *Pat Goodwin* and *Janice Ignatowski* and the Anniversary Committee and their help that made the party a big success, and to all that attended to help celebrate!

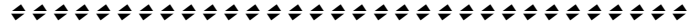
**LADIES ONLY—**
