My sincere thanks to the many, many people who helped to make the Nonagenarian party such a wonderful success.

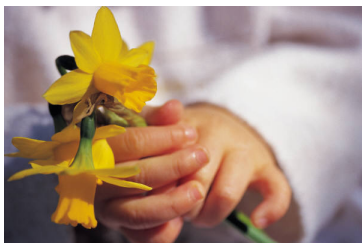

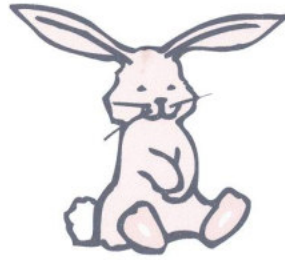
