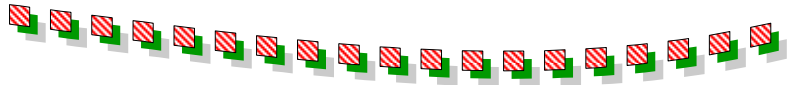
**COMBINATION CHRISTMAS BIRTHDAY PARTY**
