DEED OF RESTRICTIONS VOTE ANNOUNCED

The Laurel Estates Board of Directors announced the results of the voting of residents to amend the Deed of Restrictions. There are 191 properties in Laurel Estates, and 51% or 97 votes are required to open and amend the Deed. 63 lot owners did not return their ballot. The results were:

FOR the Changes: 50

AGAINST the Changes: 78

The Lot Owners did not approve the change and the matter is considered closed. It may, however, be revisited by a future Board.

Patricia Lara reported that, recently, the Lee County Sheriff's Office responded to a call concerning individuals on scooters at Lake Arrowhead. A group wearing all black, on scooters, with walkie talkies, very organized, along with a pick up truck which sat at the exit/entrance of Lake Arrowhead. The people on the scooters were very fast and on their walkie talkies. One of the residents called the Sheriff right away. The Deputies were able to arrest two of them and got the license plate of another.

There was also an instance where an unlicensed contractor was soliciting work within the Park and Manny contacted LCSO to have them trespassed.

IMPORTANT! - If you see anything that appears to be suspicious or people who should not be in the park, the fastest way to get a response is to call Lee County Sheriff at: (239) 477-1000. It's a non-emergency line but they seem to be able to dispatch units faster than 911.

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CLOSING YOUR HOME FOR THE SUMMER

Here are some suggestions to follow when you're closing your home for the Summer. This information is a consolidation of suggestions provided by

Tom Clark and former resident Judy Schlundt.

Kitchen / Laundry / Bathroom

- Unplug all small appliances and cover.
- Discard all perishable items
- Clean all surfaces
- Unplug or turn off refrigerator and leave door open, OR if you elect to keep it on, fill jugs with tap water and place in refrigerator (A full refrigerator/freezer will use less energy than an empty one
- Open cupboard doors
- Remove food particles from the filter in dishwasher
- Run dishwasher through short cycle
- Clean garbage disposer by running a batch of ice cubes, then running through a solution of baking soda and water. Leave stopper in place
- Block the door to the dishwasher open
- Clean oven, broiler and drip trays under surface units of range.
- Close all sink drains or cover with plastic wrap and a weight
- Unplug Microwave, stove, washer and dryer
- Turn off water to washer
- Add a cup of bleach to toilet and cover toilet and tank with plastic wrap
- Turn off water under sinks and commodes

Bedrooms

- Open all closet and cupboard doors
- Leave only clean clothes in closet
- Allow space between garments to allow for air circulation
- Don't leave items on the floor
- Use plastic hangers to prevent rust damage

Living Room

- Vacuum rugs and furniture
- Cover Living Room furniture to avoid dust and sun fade

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• Remove throw rugs from floor so carpet can breath.

Inside

- Turn off water heater at breaker box
- Set thermostat at 78-80 degrees automatic cool and humidistat at 40%-60% relative humidity
- Replace air conditioner / furnace filter
- Place lights on timers to simulate movement in house
- Close and lock all windows
- Close all blinds and drapes
- Make sure all snoke alarms are working and have fresh batteries.
- Wedge dowels in window tracks and doors to prevent burglars from opening them
- Open all doors, including closet doors to allow airflow.
- Pack all prescription medications including "refrigerated meds."

Outside

• Have your air conditioner / heater serviced

Arrange for hurricane shutters to be installed when a tropical storm/hurricane watch or warning is in effect. Have them removed a few days after the storm / hurricane has departed.

Bring cushions from patio furniture inside

Turn off main water valve

Close all exterior shutters and put awnings down

Arrange to have lawn cut and bushes trimmed regularly

Leave houseplants outside/hang in trees

Remove all furniture from lanai

General

Place a temporary stop on Newspaper Delivery

Place phone, cable and internet on "vacation status."

Return library books, rented videos/DVD's.

Unplug electrical appliances and computers susceptable to lightning and power surges.

Turn circuit breaker off to water heater.

Ask a friend, neighbor or home watch company to check on your property every week while you're away.

Activate your home security system
